members of a church.		
The Declaration of Intention, required under Canon II.7.6 of the Anglican Church in		
North America, has been signed by the bride and groom.		
There has been no more than one divorce (or annulment) for either the bride or groom.		
The marriage(s) did not end because of adultery committed by a person now seeking		
permission to remarry.		
There is demonstrated repentance for the individual's role in the break-up of the		
previous marriage. (Even if the person did not commit adultery or abandon his or her		
spouse, there are always ways in which the person sinfully contributed to the break-		
up).		
I am satisfied that the couple has an understanding of the biblical teaching about		
marriage and divorce (including the appropriateness of divorce only on biblical		
grounds) and a commitment to live under biblical principles in this marriage.		
This marriage taking place in the church would not cause scandal or offense within the		
congregation.		
The previous spouse(s) is not still in the same congregation.		
I am satisfied that this couple intends a Christian marriage which they will live out		
within and with the support of a Christian congregation.		
I believe the marriage of this couple will be a demonstrable sign of the spiritual union		
between Christ and His Church.		
They have completed or will complete prior to the wedding a program of pre-marital		
counseling satisfactory to me.		
I have met, in person, with this couple to assess their personal readiness for marriage.		
I am satisfied that this man and this woman have an adequate concern for the prior		
spouse(s) and any dependents.		
I am satisfied that this couple has the ability to handle any personal differences (e.g.		
regarding ethnicity, religious discipline, age, income, patterns of conflict) in a healthy		
manner.		
If I am not the senior ranking cleric of this congregation, I have obtained approval to		
officiate at this marriage.		
I have inquired of the parties whether they have consulted another priest or pastor of		
this or any church regarding the proposed marriage and, if they have, I have consulted		
with that member of the clergy (attach a brief explanation).		
If consent is granted, I am willing to officiate at this wedding.

marriage(s) lawfully dissolved
